Students in the Education Studies major will develop the abilities to analyze complex social issues related to education, conduct community research, and become engaged in addressing community challenges and policy-making related to schools, youth, families, health, wellness and justice issues. Students must select one of three concentrations: 1). Creativity, Innovation & Learning; 2). Equity & Educational Change; and 3). Education and Social Entrepreneurship.
